Dear Employee:

You will be enrolled in the Activision Blizzard 401(k) Plan. Take a look and see what a difference the 401(k) Plan could make in achieving your goals.

Benefit from:

401(k) Plan contributions. Through an automatic payroll deduction, you may contribute up to 75% of your eligible pay and 100% of your eligible bonus pay on a pretax and/or Roth basis, up to the annual IRS dollar limits. You may also contribute up to 20% on an after-tax basis.

Matching contributions. Activision Blizzard matches your pretax and/or Roth contributions to the 401(k) Plan. Please see the *Frequently asked questions about your 401(k) Plan* section for details on how the match is determined.

Catch-up contributions. If you make the maximum contribution to your 401(k) Plan account, and you are 50 years of age or older during the calendar year, you can make an additional "catch-up" contribution of \$7,500 in 2023. Catch-up contributions are also eligible for the company match.

Convenience. Your contributions are automatically deducted regularly from your paycheck.

Tax savings now. Your pretax contributions are deducted from your pay before income taxes are taken out. This means that you can actually lower the amount of current income taxes you pay each period. It could mean more money in your take-home pay versus saving money in a taxable account.

Tax-deferred savings opportunities. You pay no taxes on any earnings until you withdraw them from your account, enabling you to keep more of your money working for you now.

Investment options. You have the flexibility to select from investment options that range from more conservative to more aggressive, making it easy for you to develop a well-diversified investment portfolio. Your 401(k) Plan also offers you the option of having experienced professionals manage your account for you.

Automatic annual increases. Save a little more each year, the easy way — the Annual Increase Program automatically increases your contribution each year.

Online beneficiary. With Fidelity's Online Beneficiaries Service, you can designate your beneficiaries, receive instant online confirmation, and check your beneficiary information virtually any time.

Portability. You can roll over eligible savings from a previous employer into the 401(k) Plan. You can also take your 401(k) Plan vested account balance with you if you leave the company.

Frequently asked questions about your plan.

Here are answers to questions you may have about the key features, benefits, and rules of your plan.

When can I enroll in the Plan?

If you have not enrolled in the 401(k) Plan within 30 days from your date of hire, you will be automatically enrolled in the 401(k) Plan at a contribution rate of 1% of your pretax eligible earnings. Your contributions will be invested in a Vanguard Target Retirement Trust II.

Based on your date of birth and assuming a retirement age of 65, you will be invested in the Target Date Funds, with a corresponding target retirement date. Target Date Funds are an asset mix of stocks, bonds and other investments that automatically becomes more conservative as the fund approaches its target retirement date and beyond. Principal invested is not guaranteed.

However, we encourage you to take an active role in the 401(k) Plan and to choose a contribution rate and investment options that are appropriate for you. If you do not wish to contribute to the 401(k) Plan, you must change your contribution rate to 0% within 30 days from your eligibility date. You may change your contribution rate at any time online, or by calling the Fidelity Retirement Benefits Line at **800-835-5095**.

What if I'm automatically enrolled and decide not to participate in the 401(k) Plan?

If you do not want to participate in the 401(k) Plan, you may opt out within the first 90 days of employment and your contributions will be returned to you. You may opt out of automatic enrollment, or contribute at a different rate, online or by calling the Fidelity Retirement Benefits Line at **800-835-5095**.

How do I enroll in the Plan?

Enroll online at any time, or by calling the Fidelity Retirement Benefits Line at **800-835-5095**.

What is the Roth contribution option?

A Roth contribution to your 401(k) Plan allows you to make after-tax contributions and take any associated earnings completely tax free at retirement—as long as the distribution is a qualified one. A qualified distribution, in this case, is one that is taken at least five tax years after your first Roth 401(k) contribution and after you have attained age 59½, or become disabled or die. Through automatic payroll deduction, you can contribute up to 75% of your eligible pay as designated Roth contributions, up to the annual IRS dollar limits.

How much can I contribute?

Through automatic payroll deduction, you may contribute up to 75% of your eligible base pay, and 100% of your eligible bonus pay on a pretax and/or Roth basis, up to the annual IRS dollar limits. You may also contribute up to 20% on an after-tax basis.

What is the IRS contribution limit?

The IRS contribution limit for 2023 is \$22,500.

When is my enrollment effective?

Your enrollment becomes effective once you elect a deferral percentage, which initiates deduction of your contributions from your pay. These salary deductions will generally begin with your next pay period after we receive your enrollment information, or as soon as administratively possible.

Does Activision Blizzard contribute to my account?

Activision Blizzard helps your retirement savings grow by matching your contributions.

Activision Blizzard may make a discretionary matching contribution to your account. The amount would be equal to a percentage determined annually by a Board of Directors Resolution.

How the matching contribution is determined.

For most eligible employees, the company intends to match up to 25% of the compensation that the eligible employees contribute as elective deferrals (including catch-up contributions), up to the maximum elective deferral permitted by Internal Revenue Code Section 402(g) (\$22,500 for 2023) and age 50 catch-up contribution limit (\$7,500 for 2023). Any amounts you receive in employer match are 100% vested.

Can I convert all or a portion of my contributions to Roth within the 401(k)?

The Roth In-Plan Conversion feature allows active and former employees with an account balance to convert a portion or the entire plan balance to a designated Roth account within the 401(k) plan. In general, any money in your account currently not designated as Roth, including any after-tax contributions, may be converted to Roth after meeting certain requirements. Current income taxes will be due on any pretax amounts converted. This may include pretax contributions (which can be converted to Roth if you are over age 591/2), employer matching contributions, other taxdeferred money (after-tax contributions, which can be converted to Roth at any age), and all earnings converted to Roth within the Plan. There is no limit to the amount or the number of times you can convert account balances to Roth within the Plan. You can also set up an Automated Roth-In Plan Conversion to automatically convert any after-tax amounts to Roth as soon as they are posted to your account. Call the Fidelity Retirement Benefits

Line at **800-835-5095** to request a Roth In-Plan Conversion or Automated Roth In-Plan Conversion.

Be sure you understand the tax consequences before you initiate a Roth In-Plan Conversion. You may want to consult your tax advisor about your situation.

How do I designate my beneficiary?

If you have not already selected your beneficiaries, or if you have experienced a lifechanging event such as a marriage, divorce, birth of a child, or a death in the family, it's time to consider your beneficiary designations. Fidelity's Online Beneficiaries Service offers a straightforward, convenient process that takes just minutes. To make your elections, click on the "Profile" link, then select "Beneficiaries" and follow the online instructions.

What are my investment options?

To help you meet your investment goals, the Plan offers you a range of options. You can select a mix of investment options that best suits your goals, time horizon, and risk tolerance. The investment options available through the Plan include conservative, moderately conservative, and aggressive funds. A complete description of the Plan's investment options and their performance, as well as planning tools to help you choose an appropriate mix, are available online.

What are the single fund solution options in my plan?

If the idea of getting professional help to manage your investments appeals to you, your plan offers Target Date Funds. With Target Date Funds, the investment mix of stocks and bonds automatically becomes more conservative as the target retirement date approaches. Principal invested is not guaranteed at any time, including at or after the fund's target date. Choose the fund that represents your anticipated year of retirement.

What are the managed account options in my plan?

Fidelity[®] Personalized Planning & Advice ("The Service")

Fidelity[®] Personalized Planning & Advice is a retirement goal based managed account service with a team of portfolio managers who manage the investments in your workplace savings plan account. Based on your unique needs and goals, our team of professionals will create a plan that considers your total financial situation, put the plan into action, and work for you putting in the time, resources, and knowledge needed to keep you on track for retirement.

What if I don't make an investment election?

We encourage you to take an active role in the 401(k) Plan and choose investment options that best suit your goals, time horizon, and risk tolerance. If you do not select specific investment options in the 401(k) Plan, your contributions will be invested in the Vanguard Target Retirement Trust II with the target retirement date closest to the year you might retire, based on your current age and assuming a retirement age of 65, at the direction of Activision Blizzard. If no date of birth or an invalid date of birth is on file at Fidelity, your contributions will be invested in the Vanguard Target Retirement Income Trust II. More information about the Vanguard

When am I vested?

You are always 100% vested in your contributions to the 401(k) Plan.

Can I take a loan from my account?

Although your 401(k) Plan account is intended for the future, you may borrow from your account for any reason.

Can I make withdrawals?

Withdrawals from the 401(k) Plan are generally permitted when you terminate your employment, retire, reach age 591/2, or have a severe financial hardship, as defined by your 401(k) Plan.

When you leave Activision Blizzard, you can withdraw contributions and any associated earnings or, if your vested account balance is greater than \$5,000, you can leave contributions and any associated earnings in the 401(k) Plan. After you leave Activision Blizzard, if your vested account balance is equal to or less than \$1,000, it will automatically be distributed to you. However, if your vested account balance is greater than \$1,000 but not more than \$5,000, you will be notified that your entire vested account balance will be transferred to an individual retirement account (rollover IRA), unless you request either a cash distribution or a rollover distribution of your choice.

Can I move money from another

retirement plan into my account in the Activision Blizzard 401(k) Plan?

You are permitted to roll over eligible pretax, Roth, or after-tax contributions from another 401(k) plan, 401(a) plan, 403(b) plan, or governmental 457(b) retirement plan account or eligible pretax contributions from another account or eligible pretax contributions from conduit individual retirement accounts (IRAs) or certain nonconduit individual retirement accounts (traditional IRAs, Simplified Employee Pension plans, and "SIMPLE" IRA distributions made more than two years from the date you first participated in the SIMPLE IRA). A conduit IRA is one that contains only money rolled over from an employer-sponsored retirement plan that has not been mixed with regular IRA contributions. The 401(k) Plan also accepts distributions from spousal beneficiary and qualified domestic relations order (QDRO).

Fund Objective: The Fund seeks safety of principal and consistency of returns while attempting to maintain minimal volatility. The Fund is designed for investors seeking more income than money market funds without the price fluctuation of stock or bond funds.

Fund Strategy: The Fund's underlying fixed income strategy is managed in a conservative style that utilizes a disciplined value investing process to build a high quality portfolio with broad diversification and an emphasis on risk management. The core investment philosophy is to build a portfolio of realizable yield through bottom-up, fundamental research, utilizing a teambased approach to portfolio management. Galliard's fixed income portfolios emphasize high quality spread sectors, diversification across sectors and issuers to reduce risk, neutral duration positioning, and a laddered portfolio structure for ample natural liquidity.

The majority of the Fund's assets will be invested in fixed income portfolios that are wrapped by stable value contracts which allow Fund participants to transact at book value. The Fund will hold cash in order to maintain sufficient liquidity, and may also invest in traditional GICs. The Fund utilizes high credit quality stable value contract issuers, with an emphasis on diversification.

What is the Roth 401(k) Contribution Option?

A Roth contribution is available to employees who participate in the 401(k) plan. For payroll purposes, Roth contributions are treated as after tax. This feature will allow participants to make Roth contributions to their plan while taking their earnings completely **tax-free** at retirement—as long as the withdrawal is a qualified one. A qualified withdrawal is one that can be taken five tax years after the year of the first Roth contribution *and* after the participant has attained age 59½, has become disabled, or has died.

If you qualify to make traditional 401(k) contributions, you are eligible for a Roth 401(k) contribution.

How does a Roth 401(k) contribution option work?

You elect an amount of your salary that you wish to contribute to the Roth source, just as you would for your traditional 401(k). The contribution is based on your eligible compensation, not on your net pay — for example, if your total annual eligible compensation is \$40,000 per year and you elect a 6% deferral amount, then \$2,400 per year would go into your Roth 401(k) account.

Unlike your traditional 401(k) pretax contribution, with a Roth 401(k) contribution, you pay the taxes now on the contributions you make—but later your earnings are all tax-free, if you meet certain criteria.

Example: Sally earns \$40,000 and has elected to put 6% toward her Roth 401(k) contributions and 6% toward her traditional 401(k) pretax contributions on a monthly basis.

Your combined Roth and traditional pretax 401(k) contributions cannot exceed the IRS limits for the year.

Would a Roth 401(k) contribution option benefit me?

The potential benefits of Roth 401(k) contributions really depend on your personal situation, but are mainly focused on your existing tax rate and your anticipated tax rate at the time of retirement. If you are contributing to a Roth, you are giving up a tax break today for a tax break in the future.

Therefore, a Roth contribution might benefit you if your tax rate in retirement were **higher** than it had been during the years you contributed.

If your tax rate were **lower** in retirement, then a traditional 401(k) might be more beneficial to you than the Roth option. Talk with a tax professional for more information on how to determine if Roth 401(k) contributions are right for you.

Is a traditional pretax 401(k) still beneficial?

Yes. For many participants, a traditional pretax 401(k) will still be the most beneficial type of retirement savings plan. We do not know what the future holds regarding tax rates. Therefore, it is not possible to predict with certainty which type of 401(k) savings will be most beneficial to a participant.

Remember, because Roth 401(k) contributions are made after tax, you may take home less money in your paycheck than you would if you contributed to a traditional pretax 401(k).
